

General Data Protection Regulations

As you may be aware, the law is changing on 25th May and new regulations regarding Data, its use and storage will be coming into force on that date. The changes are wide ranging and will affect the parish in various ways. We have been advised that one of the ways which will impact on us is that we are no longer able to announce names of those who are sick unless they personally ask that their name be announced.

Please note that this does not mean they can no longer be prayed for, it does mean that their name cannot be announced unless they personally ask for that to happen. A letter, an email, even via the phone or other indirect means of communication are not acceptable under the law. The request must also be given in writing so that proof of the request can be retained.

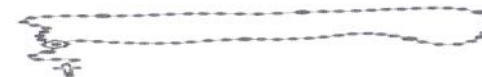
